► To mark National Dyslex8ia Week, the children were invited to break down a barrier of straw bales.


This symbolises how they can break down the barrier to learning that dyslexia presents.

► It was also nice to see their new tutors speaking so fondly of how they have settled into life at the senior school.




Blitz Art!




Secret Santa.

Blue Class decided to simulate the fossilisation process using bread and some other tasty treats.


► They placed the treats on to a slice of bread, then layered other more slices of bread on top of those to represent the many layers of rock that bury fossils.

That's the challenge of Archaeology – the study of human activity through exceivating sites and analysing artefacts and other physical remains.

Each period of human settlement leaves a layer of remains. These build up over time and an archaeologist will carefully work through them to discover what they can about the lives of our ancestors This section (called stratigraphy) shows how the layers might be arranged in an excavated trench.

► Many thanks to Beth from Funk Fusion Fitness for coming in for the morning.




It's in the stars
